Maintaining a most precious building

The Tudor roses have been eroded by acid rain, some of the stone animal figures are unrecognisable and the stonework framing the stained glass is being cracked by the 16th century iron bars holding the glass in place. Now the first stage of a £3 million programme of essential work to repair and refurbish the Chapel is underway, King's members Robin Boyle and Sunny Pal generously contributing to the costs.

The Chapel, which is almost 500 years old, is one of the most iconic and precious buildings not only in Cambridge, but arguably the world; King's takes very seriously its duty to maintain it. Income from visitor admissions help considerably with running costs, but does not cover refurbishment, and the College receives no grants or external funding for the Chapel. It is therefore deeply appreciative of donations towards its upkeep.

Thank you

In this snapshot of the College's finances we are pleased to acknowledge our many generous donors and volunteers, and to thank you for helping the College with such enthusiasm, and in various ways, last year.

We are even more pleased to report that many more of you supported the College, making it a very good year for fundraising.

This report provides information from the financial year 2007/08. Our full accounts can be found on the website, and more detailed reports from each department are in the *Annual Report 2008*. What you have here, for the second year running, are the key facts about the College's finances at a glance.

For the third year in a row, King's has produced a small surplus from its operations. Last year the College increased its income and also spent more. At the same time, the College continues to monitor expenditure carefully to ensure that money is well used. The areas of expenditure are illustrative of the College's priorities: we increased spending significantly for student support and building maintenance. We are working actively on long term planning to invest more in facilities for students and Fellows so that the College can continue to provide the academic excellence for which it is known.

But the year ahead looks very different. The gloom in the financial world will not leave the College unscathed. We aim to manage our funds prudently. However, like all investors, we have seen a drop in the value of our total assets which will in turn affect the amount of money available to spend next year.

At the same time, education is becoming more expensive both for students and the College. The supervision system, so dear to King's, is the most expensive form of education there is but we believe it is also the best. We remain committed to the quality of the education we provide and to selecting the brightest students we can find, independently of their means. Fees and operating income simply do not cover the full cost of education at King's. We depend on income from our endowment and donations to fill the gap.

So next year your support will be more important than ever before. We hope that you will be as generous to King's as your personal circumstances allow. This is your College, and with your help it can continue imaginatively to create opportunities for generations to come.

Grace Collord, 21, fourth year medical student from the USA, recipient of a grant from the Kendal Dixon Studentship Fund, supported by Jafar Askari (KC 1957)

At the end of my undergraduate degree at King's, I was at a crossroads. I had studied medicine for three years but faced the prospect of having to stop. I had used up all my savings and my parents could not afford to pay more fees. Having come so far, this was absolutely gut-wrenching.

And I wanted very badly to stay on at King's as I had been so impressed by the teaching, the students and the unpretentious and open-minded atmosphere of the College. I felt strongly that I wanted to continue my medical studies in Europe as I didn't want to end up working in the US health system.

When the College said they could help me with a King's studentship, paid for by private donors, I was absolutely overjoyed. Because it is a grant, not a loan, I can also realise my dream of going to work in the developing world, where paying back a loan would be hard on a low salary. I have long hoped to work for an organisation like Medecins Sans Frontières.

I appreciate tremendously the support of King's and hope to one day repay the debt I owe the College so someone else can benefit as I did.

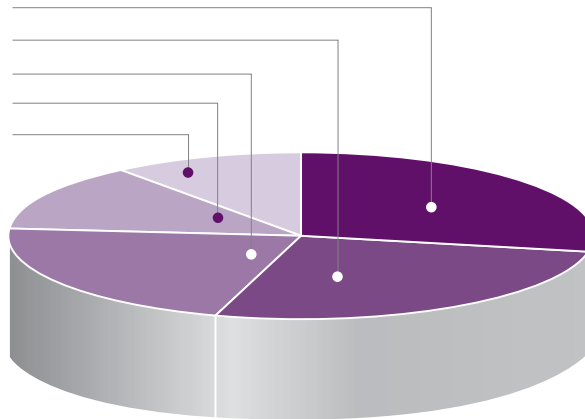
Income

King's College is a charitable corporate body established by Royal Charter in 1441 with perpetual status, and recognised under Common Law as a place of education, religion, learning and research. The College funds its activities from academic fees, charges to members for residence and catering, income from its conference and catering business, its invested endowments and from donations and legacies. The College has generated a small surplus for the past three years: £680,000 on the revenue account in 07/08, up from £661,000 in 06/07.

Only a small portion of our income (10.8%) comes from academic fees, the majority of the College's income derives from its investments and operations. All main areas of King's income increased this year. Most notably, academic fees and charges were up 10.2% due to an increase in student numbers; residence, catering and conference rose 12.9%; tourist admissions to the Chapel (under 'other') also rose by 8.4%.

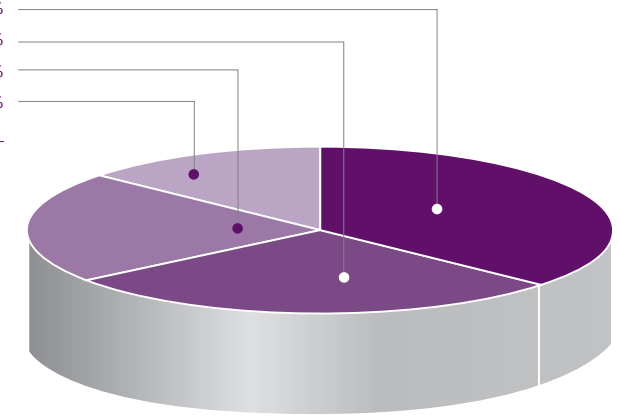
Expenditure

So far as is consistent with balancing the needs of current and future generations of beneficiaries, the College aims to spend as much as possible on its charitable objectives in any period, by using funds from its operations and from its endowment investments. As more money came into the College, more money was spent. Costs as a whole rose by 12%; staff costs rose 4.8% while operating expenditure rose by 25.9%. Included in operating expenditure was £674,000 for student support, an increase of 35% on the previous year, and a 21% increase in building maintenance. The College subsidises the cost of education as well as costs for student accommodation and catering explaining the shortfall between residence and catering income and expenditure.

Capital expenditure

The College incurs and will continue to incur significant expenditure on the maintenance of its historic buildings. Expenditure of some £12 million (in current costs) is expected to be required during the coming years (including £3 million on the Chapel). The College has embarked on a major refurbishment project of Market Hostel, one of the College's large accommodation buildings. The total cost of this is expected to be in the region of £8.5 million over the next three years. The College expects its fundraising activities to contribute towards funding these projects.

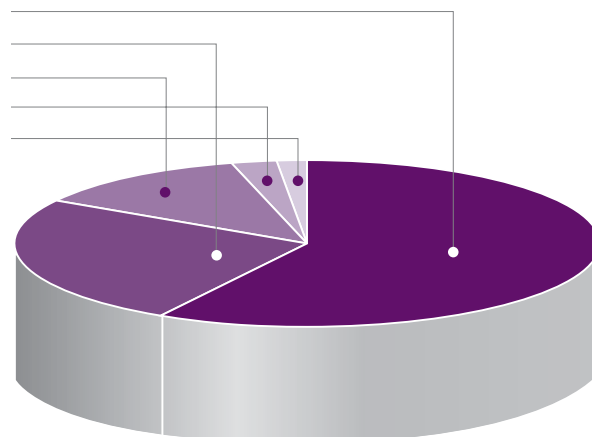
How King's invests

The College aims to manage its endowment on the basis of total return over the long term that will provide for real increases in annual expenditure, will keep pace with its own inflation rate and grow the capital base in real terms, and so meet the needs of both current and future generations. The College aims to diversify its investments in order to reduce volatility in the short to medium term. In selecting investments, the College regards income yield and prospects of capital gains as sustainable.

In reaction to the deterioration of economic conditions at the end of the financial year, the College moved £10 million out of equities into cash. This decision helped reduce the fall in the capital value of the endowment to just 7.6% while the FT All Share Index fell 16.1% in 07/08. Currently, the cash holding as a percentage of assets is high and the College will be seeking to re-balance the portfolio when it is prudent to do so, looking to capitalise on investment opportunities in the future.

Next year

Endowment income for 07/08 was determined on the basis of the actual dividends and rent received during the year. In the light of the re-adoption of the 'Total Return' basis of investment management, the College has adopted a 'spending rule' to budget endowment income for 08/09 where the amount equivalent to 4% of the average endowment for the three preceding years is to be used. Expenditure budgets for the 08/09 financial year were established on a break even basis after projecting revenue from operations and using the 4% spending rule to determine endowment income.

“ I am working to find efficient methods for controlling the spread of disease ”

Joshua Ross, 27, Zukerman Fellow, recipient of a four year Junior Research Fellowship funded by M. Zukerman (KC 1966)

Unlike most post doctoral fellows at my stage, I get great academic freedom thanks to this Fellowship. I work in epidemiology, applying maths and economics to combating infectious diseases – a new, emerging discipline. It is about working out the best way to spend money to intervene and stop the prevalence of a disease. My goal is to create a systematic approach for controlling all kinds of infectious diseases, and to create models that will help society respond most efficiently.

I would also like to apply these methods to conservation biology, something which means a lot to me coming from Australia which has a huge number of endemic, and threatened, species.

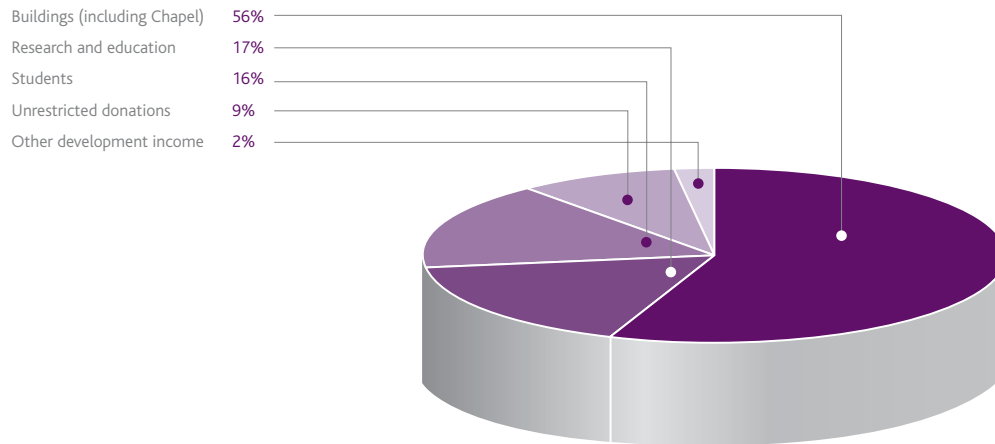
Maths has always appealed to me: you can use it to study just about anything! I am very grateful for the Zukerman Research Fellowship as it allows me to take my research to a new level – I feel very inspired to keep working towards solutions to health and conservation biology problems.

Donations to King's 2007/08

More donors are supporting the College: last year 35% of donors gave for the first time and 11% of members donated overall, compared with 5% in 2006/07.

In financial year 2007/08 £2.2 million in new cash and pledges was raised. Overall our cash income in the year (both new cash and realised past pledges) more than doubled to £2.1 million. The number of donors to the College also rose: 11% of members gave to the College, compared with 5% in 2006. There were also many new donors: 35% of last year's donors gave to the College for the first time. The telephone fundraising campaign in October 2007 was the most successful to date, bringing in £205,000 for the current funding needs of the College, with a pledge fulfilment rate of 126%, 24% higher than the year before.

How donations were spent in 2007/08

Restricted funds

When a gift is made to one of the College's restricted funds, you can be sure that the money will be spent for that intended purpose only. The spending rules of restricted funds are contained in the terms of each individual fund. If the terms allow, the College aims to spend the income arising from such funds and to retain the capital, unless the donor has specified that the capital be spent. A few examples of how this money is used:

The Supplementary Exhibition Fund (SEF)

This was established in 1886 to award money to students of limited means to improve their 'welfare' in the broadest terms. Last year £215,000 was disbursed from the SEF to 129 students.

The Chapel Fund

A general fund established in 1956, this is for the maintenance and embellishment of the Chapel. Last year £171,000 from the Chapel Fund was spent on the upkeep of the building. Two major gifts destined for the Chapel were also received from individual donors allowing the first phase of a major restoration project on the Chapel fabric and the complete restoration and adornment of the Founder's Side Chapel.

The Bob Alexander Fund

This fund was launched in 2006 to name a teaching Fellow in Law in Bob Alexander's name. Over £740,000 has been raised to date and recruitment has begun to name a Law Fellow in the Michaelmas term 2009. The goal is to raise £2 million to name a Fellow in perpetuity.

Unrestricted funds: the Annual Fund

Money given to King's Annual Fund is unrestricted. This means that the College spends the money in the year and it is included in general College income. Last year new cash and pledges to the Annual Fund totalled £612,000. At a 4% interest rate, it would take an additional £15.3 million of endowment to generate this amount.

King's relies on income from its endowment to fund its operations, so any fall in the value of its assets also affects the College's ability to assist students, fund research or repair buildings

Income from tuition fees, accommodation and catering do not cover the full cost of educating and housing students at King's. Each year the College contributes significant sums to subsidise students. It is estimated that Cambridge Colleges contribute on average at least £2,500 for each student educated at the University. Added to this last year King's provided an additional £674,000 of direct financial support for tuition and living expenses. Donations to the Annual Fund help to directly offset the cost of educating and housing students, enabling the College to invest in other areas such as essential maintenance and restoration projects, and improving facilities.

Looking to next year: a time of challenge

At the time of this writing, the world is facing an unprecedented financial crisis. King's relies on income from its endowment to fund its operations, so any fall in the value of its assets also affects the College's ability to assist students, fund research or repair buildings.

Faced with an inevitable fall in investment income, the College will have no choice but to radically cut spending at a time when higher education is becoming more and more expensive both for students and for Colleges.

But you can make a difference and support from our donors is more important now than ever. Every donation, of any size, is deeply appreciated and will count to help the College achieve its educational mission. You can be assured that your money will be put to good use.

While major, six figure gifts and legacies are very important to the College, the cumulative effect of smaller gifts for current use can also make a significant contribution to the College's ability to deliver educational excellence. Next year, we encourage donors to contribute to the Annual Fund. For those who have never made a gift to King's, please consider donating this year.
